
ZIZ PROGRAMS: Choose one of the Ziz books: *The Hardest Word, Noah and the Ziz, The Ziz and the Hanukkah Miracle,* or *The Princess and the Ziz* for a family story time featuring the Ziz puppet, songs, and a flannel board building of the Ziz. (ages 3-8)





SHABBAT THEME STORY TIME: Learn Shabbat songs, roar with a bear puppet, chant Yiddish words, and sing the joyful chorus of *Once Upon a Shabbos.* This program can conclude with cooking "Bubbe's Shabbos Kugel" recipe from the book. (ages 3-8)

BIBLICAL HEROES: With songs and projected images from *Abraham's Search for God, Sarah Laughs, Benjamin and the Silver Goblet,* and *Miriam in the Desert,* beloved biblical heroes will come alive for young audiences. Program can be tailored for age groups between the ages of 5-10 and can include *Goodnight Sh'ma.*





SUMMER CAMP FUN: Sing camp songs and discuss friendship with *Picnic at Camp Shalom,* a picture book about two girls who form a lasting bond at a Jewish summer camp. This program can include a discussion of the writing process. (Ages 5-10)

CELEBRATE THE NEW YEAR: With Rosh Hashanah songs and activities, this holiday program features *What a Way to Start a New Year*, a story about a family adjusting to a move and making new friends at synagogue. (Ages 3-8)





MAKING FRIENDS: How do you resolve conflicts? Is it possible to become friends with someone who hurt your feelings? *Never Say a Mean Word Again* explores these questions in a story inspired by a legend from medieval Spain about Samuel Ha-Nagid. Program includes a conflict resolution song and discussion. (Grades 1-4)
